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BRITTANY'S STORY

Brittany Roter wanted so badly to bask in the excitement of her pregnancy. Just four months along with her second child, she received the most devastating news a mother could ever hear – you have cancer.

At 33, the Apsley resident was diagnosed with colorectal cancer after experiencing a sudden medical episode while out with her family.

"At the time, my heart broke for the tiny human I was growing because her future was so uncertain. We didn't know if she would make it." "Despite everything that was happening, I knew one thing – I was ready to fight for our lives."

And fight she did.

Over the past year, Brittany visited five hospitals, has undergone six rounds of chemo, 25 radiation treatments, and two surgeries.

Two days before her scheduled induction, Brittany learned that thanks to the care she was receiving, her tumor was gone! She received some well deserved peace before welcoming baby Hunter in January 2024. Additional radiation at Lakeridge Health came after, but she didn't give up hope.

"Cancer has taken so much from me but it didn't take me from my family, and it didn't take my baby girl."

Donations to cancer care at Lakeridge Health directly support patients like Brittany by helping to fund critical equipment, like Smart IV Pumps used to administer chemotherapy and Linear Accelerators that provide 40,000 radiation treatments each year.

And when it comes to supporting your local hospital, Brittany has simple advice. "Just do it. You think it may not be you... but take it from me, one day it could be."

Soon, these important diagnoses will only be one click away!

In the past, oncologists relied on the laboratory to determine whether cancer was simply present. Today, our pathologists work hand in hand with the oncology team to indicate a patient's exact type of cancer and provide detailed information on the best treatment plan.

Now, further innovation of digital pathology at our Hospitals will allow our experts to review cancer cells faster than ever before and share laboratory results anywhere – eliminating the need for physical transportation and ensuring the right experts can weigh in for every patient.

The need for pathology is higher than ever before, and complex cancer cases are on the rise. Artificial intelligence technology will also be introduced to support pathologists reviewing tissue samples, improving workflow and speeding up reporting time.

This is just one example of how donor support is helping advance cancer care in all aspects of the patient journey and how exceptional cancer care can and should be available close to home.

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What Matters Most: Upcoming Needs of our Hospitals

With over 269,000 patients served across all hospital sites, Lakeridge Health is constantly upgrading and replacing equipment to better care for our community.

Large-scale investments like a surgical robot or PET-CT scanner have an incredible impact on our region, but smaller, every-day pieces of equipment are at the core of patient care.

Over the next few months, we'll be working with the community to fund 59 additional AED machines and 36 patient lifts for our Oshawa Hospital.

As you know, AEDs, or Automatic External Defibrillators, are critical devices that save lives during cardiac arrest when someone's heart suddenly stops. Each new AED is \$3,200.

Portable patient lifts reduce the risk of injury for our staff and provide a safer way to move or transfer patients who cannot otherwise move themselves. Each lift is \$3,000 and will benefit numerous departments at our Oshawa Hospital.
